Call to Order and Roll Call:

06-07-2005 Minutes:

Motion: Virginia Brooks made a motion to accept the Minutes of the 06-07-2005 and 06-14-2005 Steering Committee Meetings as presented by Secretary, Williams. Dan Kairis seconded, and the motion carried, unanimously.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report:

Virginia Brooks reported that the NFC had received \$102 in donations from Richard Green, \$50 in donations from Lorie Weston, and \$25 towards a newsletter subscription, giving the NFC a total of \$177 on hand.

Motion: David Denny made a motion that the NFC Treasurer pay \$152 to Virginia Brooks towards the \$400 that she advanced the NFC in the purchase of the 1250 Multilith Off-Set Press, leaving a balance due to Ms Brooks of \$248. Robert Williams seconded, and the motion carried, unanimously.

Motion: David Denny made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented by the temporary Treasurer. Robert Williams seconded, and the motion carried, unanimously.

Illegal Immigration Committee Report:

Committee Chair, Robert Williams reported that the IIC met on June 17, and the committee wished to submit the following three letters to the SC, with the recommendation that they be used by the NFC as needed.

La Raza Letter #1 (businesses):

Dear Sir or Madam,

As American Citizens, we are contacting you because it has come to our attention that your (company/organization) has been providing financial support for a group known as La Raza (The Race), web site location: <http://www.laraza.com/>. Their name denotes racism. Minimal investigation reveals this group to be promoting extreme racism against U. S. Citizens. The United States has been diligent in its efforts to eradicate the racial discrimination that La Raza now promotes. These practices supported by La Raza are outrageous and destructive to the very core values expressed in the Constitution of the United States, and deteriorate our national unity. La Raza is being supported by another radical group known as La Voz de Aztlan, whose web site can be located at www.aztlan.net. La Voz de Aztlan is actively, and successfully, promoting the invasion, conquest, and secession of portions of the United States. This group

has posted a map (see below) on their website that specifically details the areas targeted for conquest. These Western and South Western portions of the United States include; California, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico, and parts of Utah and Texas.

Further, La Voz de Aztlan blatantly displays an emblem on their web site which depicts the historic United States Flag raising on Iwo Jima as Aztlan heroism (see below). The substitution of Mexicans and a Mexican flag, in place of the brave U.S. Marines that fought so valiantly to raise the U.S. flag on Iwo Jima, is a terrible insult. This blatant disrespect cannot, and should not be ignored.

We ask that (company/organization) reconsider giving financial support to La Raza and like organizations that work contrary to the best interests and future of the United States and it's citizenry.
