

Steering Committee Meeting #44
New Frontier Coalition
12-20-05

Call to Order and Roll Call:

9:42 p.m., EST/8:42 p.m., CST... Chairman, Richard Green called the meeting to order.

Motion: Richard Green made a motion to suspend the regular agenda and discuss what to do (The NFC) next. Dan Kairis seconded, and the motion carried, unanimously.

Chairman, Green, read the following into the minutes:

The revelation that President Mumbles And Stumbles signed an order to use the NSA to spy on American citizens, in the wake of the September 11th massacre, ought not to be a surprise to much of anyone. It simply confirms, I believe what many of us have been feeling for some years. That feeling is that the Bush family has been using every device in their considerable toolbox of political devices to create for themselves an Imperial Dynasty here in the U.S.

That in George the Lesser they have installed an Idiot King who has been manipulated by his father and by his V.P. for almost the whole of his adult political life. And further, protected by Skull & Bones from inside the highest levels of corporate and political elites, and massaged by some very clever operatives of some very nasty anti-American cells.

Their goal is now obvious: they want to terminate what's left of the republican union of States and install a Caesar, whether it is W. the Lesser or someone else named Bush, is irrelevant. That Caesar will do to the U.S. what the original Caesar did to Rome at the end of their Republic.

The Constitution Party seems to be growing but the hard part of their "doctrine" is that they seem to be reluctant to accept "other than Christians" in their movement.

So what are we to do?

Try to continue 'herding cats'? Form a political action committee and try to raise some money for mainstream politicians we agree with? Or just settle for having a think tank on the immigration question and give up the rest of any kind of political and independent agenda?

After all, if the GOP moves any kind of an acceptable border security program, and W. the Lesser signs it, there goes our main issue off the table and out the window.

Trust me, I think we all know that they've read their mail and looked at Lou Dobbs on this matter and figured out that their Congressional jobs are at risk if they DO NOT ACT.

Then again, W. the lesser may torpedo their attempts and leave them all hanging. I don't know what to think of that.
